ICE Breaker: What is a gift you'd like to receive this Christmas?

LARGE GROUP QUESTIONS:

The Lord calls Mary to the most **extraordinary calling** ever given to mankind—to become the **mother** of God's own Son. Think of how **incredible** that calling is, how almost ridiculous that sounds. How do you raise God's own Son in your home? All the angels of heaven watch your every move, knowing the fate of humanity is being determined in your home!

1. How has God ever called you to **do something** that was **difficult**, even almost **ridiculous**?

(Read verse 34-38, 46-47) Mary's response to God's amazing call on her life is predictable. "How will this be...since I am a virgin?" If Mary first doubted God, imagine what others were thinking or saying about her when she told them she was pregnant, though she is still a virgin. And that her child is God's own Son. Imagine the inevitable **ridicule** and **gossip** surrounding her pregnancy.

So how does Mary respond? She accepts God's call on her life, "I am the Lord's servant." Then she **sings**. She worships the Lord proclaiming, "My soul **glorifies** the Lord and my spirit **rejoices** in God my Savior!" In the face of God's most incredible calling upon her life, Mary blesses God for choosing her and rejoices. She **does not worry** about **what other people think**.

2. In doing what you know to be right, how do you handle the opinions, even ridicule from others?

(Read verses 51-53) Our world **values** the **confident** and **outspoken**—those who sound like they know what they are doing. The world values **rulers** and those in **high position**—those with power. It values and copies the behavior and fashion of the **rich** and **famous**.

However, Mary declares that God values the opposite. He is "mindful of servants" (48), but scatters "those who are proud" (51). "He has brought down rulers from their thrones, but has lifted up the humble (52)". "He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty (53)."

3. How do you see the **conflict** between what the **world values** and what **God values** in your **daily life**?

(Read verse 46-49) Mary was **amazed** that the God of the universe was "**mindful** of the humble state of his **servant**." God was mindful of her, a servant girl. In effect, Mary testified to these truths. **God sees us**. He sees us **where we are at**. He sees us in our **poverty**—all those areas where we are poor. We may be lacking in finances, possessions or education. We be lacking in friends, family, or love. It does not matter. In our poverty, God sees us. Not only does He see us, **He is doing something about it**.

God is preparing to **bless us** in our poverty so that with Mary we may also testify, "From now on all generations will call me **blessed** for **the Mighty One** has done **great things** for **me**—holy is His name."

4. How have you ever seen God do **great things** in areas where you are **lacking** or **struggling**?
